



Community members help save lives

Approximately 39,000 units of blood are needed in hospitals across the country every day. Blood could be needed by a mother experiencing complications during birth, a father undergoing heart surgery, a child receiving chemotherapy treatments or a grandparent with severe anemia.

To help meet these demands, Mile Bluff Medical Center in Mauston recently hosted a community blood drive on March 25. The event was a partnership between the medical center and the Blood Center of Wisconsin - the only supplier of blood to Mile Bluff.

At the drive a total of 47 area residents came to Mile Bluff to make a donation. From these individuals, 38 units of whole blood, four units of double red cells, and one unit of platelets were collected. Each of these donations can help improve the lives of up to three people in need. That means that the donations from this event alone will have the potential to impact nearly 115 individuals!

In addition to the donors, blood drive organizers would like to thank Mile Bluff's Food and Nutrition Department for providing refreshments, Eastern Star for volunteering to serve the food, the staff from the Blood Center of Wisconsin in Marshfield for making a trip to Mauston, and everyone else who helped get the word out about the event.

If you missed this most recent opportunity to make an impact on the local blood supply, Mile Bluff will be holding another drive on Monday, May 20 from 9 am to 2 pm both days. If you choose to donate, you will have the opportunity to make a whole blood, double red or platelet donation. In 1997, Barb Iwanowicz joined the Mile Bluff team. She first began as a certified medical assistant at the Necedah Family Medical Center. She then worked in several other departments before going back to school to become a registered nurse. After earning her degree, Barb managed the Necedah facility for over two years; and she now serves as a diabetes educator in the Health Promotion Department.

The fact that she has had the opportunity for professional growth, is one factor that has kept Barb with the organization for so long. "At Mile Bluff, there is room for personal development, and advancement within and across the organization." She continued, "Working at Mile Bluff can be whatever you want it to be. If you seize the opportunity to discover what you want to do, it can be done if you are willing to put forth the effort. At Mile Bluff, the possibilities are endless."

Barb explains her current role as diabetes educator, "My personal challenge is to help people understand and discover what motivates them, whether they are newly diagnosed or have had diabetes for years. Doing this helps them stay active in managing their disease."

Barb continued, "I really enjoy watching patients come full-circle. I like seeing positive outcomes that are a direct result of having a continuity of care. To me, it's a big deal to see the overall quality of a patient's life improve."

In discussing what helps to keep her motivated, Barb stated, "I get to interact with a diverse group of patients, many of whom have been through a lot in life. I understand that talking to one more healthcare provider about what they should and should not do is the last thing most people want, but I take pride in helping them learn ways they can take control of their diabetes. I like having them leave with smiles on their faces."

The overall small-town community atmosphere found at Mile Bluff also helps Barb stay dedicated to her work. "In a rural community, people take time to remember your name and the details about your life," explains Barb. "We also make the extra effort to 'pay-it-forward.' This is one thing that really sets Mile Bluff apart, and it makes it easy to serve on this team. Not to mention, the level of professionalism and the dedication to patients...that is something else that has kept me here."

Barb is just one of the many individuals who is proud to be an employee at Mile Bluff. Foundation scholarship allows Mile Bluff to offer advanced therapy method

Eye movement desensitization and reprocessing (EMDR) is a method of therapy that has been used to help millions of people, of all ages, relieve many types of psychological stress. Thanks to a scholarship from the foundation, Mile Bluff therapist, Judy Bessac, recently received training in EMDR, and has been using it to help local patients regain control of their lives.

Judy explains, "Research shows that the treatment method is extremely effective for helping individuals who are emotionally or mentally 'stuck' on certain problems or issues in their lives." She continues, "Those who can have breakthroughs with EMDR include people who have experienced physical or sexual abuse, individuals who have been through traumatic car accidents or war, and even those who are being held back in life by obsessive compulsive disorder, depression, anxiety, somatic disorder, pain issues, phobias, grief, anger and more."

The EMDR method works by taking past memories that cause present disturbances, and reprocessing them to influence future actions. The 'processing' part of therapy does not mean talking through the issues. Instead, it assists in setting up a learning state-of-mind, allowing the problematic experiences to be 'digested' and stored in the brain differently. The inappropriate emotions that were once there - beliefs, physical sensations, distressing imagery, disturbing thoughts and uncontrolled feelings - will be discarded or will lose their impact; and they will be replaced with healthy emotions.

Judy states, "Negative emotions, feelings and behaviors are generally caused by unresolved earlier experiences that are pushing you in the wrong directions. The goal of EMDR therapy is to leave you with the emotions, understanding and perspectives that will lead to healthy and useful behaviors and interactions."

When she heard of EMDR, Judy wanted to learn more. She looked into training programs, and applied for assistance to fund her education. 

Rubicon, WI Student Wins Best of Show for 2013 Wisconsin Junior Duck Stamp Art Contest

NECEDAH, Wisc. (FWS) – This year’s Best of Show winner for the Wisconsin Federal Junior Duck Stamp Design Contest is 17 year-old Drake Schlosser from Rubicon, WI. Schlosser’s acrylic painting depicting a common goldeneye will be submitted to compete at the National Federal Junior Duck Stamp Design Contest in April.

17 year-old Rachel Glaza from Nekoosa High School in Nekoosa, WI won the Wisconsin Conservation Message with her statement, “Even an animal so common as a duck still affects it’s ecosystem and has importance in its life. Creating art such as this can make that apparent.” Both the best of show artwork and the conservation message will be used to promote the 2014 WI state contest.

The Federal Junior Duck Stamp Contest is a dynamic educational program that uses both conservation and design principles as educational methods to teach students in kindergarten through high school about wetland habitats and waterfowl biology. This program provides an opportunity for students across the nation to express their knowledge of North American waterfowl, goose, and swan species through submission of an artwork entry.

The 2013 Wisconsin Junior Duck Stamp Design Contest drew 490 entries from students attending 40 different schools. “I continue to be impressed at the ability of Wisconsin’s young wildlife artists’ ability to capture life-like depictions of waterfowl. The entries are breathtaking!” said Katie Goodwin, Wisconsin Federal Junior Duck Stamp State Coordinator. “This contest really is the highlight of our year, and we feel privileged to be able to share in both the educators’ and students’ hard work in waterfowl and wetland conservation education.”

Wisconsin students were required to submit their artwork by March 15, 2013 to Necedah National Wildlife Refuge (Refuge), the state coordinator headquarters. This artwork was then judged by a panel wildlife and art experts on Friday, March 29, 2013 at the Refuge. Artwork entries were judged based on original design, anatomical accuracy, artistic composition, and suitability for reproduction on a 1” by 1.5” stamp.

This year’s judges were a dynamic group of waterfowl enthusiasts, each stemming from various backgrounds. The 2013 WI judges included: Diane Dahl, professional artists, Jay Jocham, professional artists, Mark Pfost, Private Lands Biologist stationed at Necedah National Wildlife Refuge, Nancy Steinback, retired art teacher and volunteer at Horicon National Wildlife Refuge, and Ashly Steinke, wetland and environmental consultant with Foggy Acres Wetlands, LLC.

Schlosser’s best of show artwork will compete at the National Federal Junior Duck Stamp Contest April 19 at the National Conservation Training Center in Shepherdstown, WV. This young artist will compete with other student wildlife artists from across the U.S., in hopes of their winning entry being made into the National Junior Duck Stamp. Stamps are available for purchase from the U.S. Postal Service as well as many National Wildlife Refuges for \$5.00. Proceeds from stamp sales support conservation education in the form of awards and scholarships for participants.

The top 36 winning entries from the state of Wisconsin have been reproduced and will be showcased in two traveling displays at 17 locations across the state, from May 2013 – March 2014. For a schedule of the traveling display locations, or for additional information about the 2013 contest, please contact WI Junior Duck Stamp State Coordinators, Katie Goodwin or Kara Zwickey, at Necedah National Wildlife Refuge at 608.565.2551 or Necedah@fws.gov.


