



The day's events were slightly delayed by rain, but swung into action shortly after 1 pm with a shotgun start. Golfers had the opportunity to participate in games throughout Castle Rock Golf Course, and competed for a variety of prizes as well.



The excitement continued into the evening as those in attendance enjoyed a delicious buffet and carried on with the friendly competition with Chinese and 50/50 raffles. Some of the items up for grabs were gift certificates for local restaurants, wines, chocolates, a pontoon boat rental, and golf clubs. A 2013 Buick Verano was one of the hole-in-one prizes; and although one golfer was only two-inches from winning, no one went home with the car. During this time, the winners of the golf outing were also announced.

"Although it was a little soggy, we had a very successful event," said Martha Airth-Kindree, Foundation Executive Director. "I want to thank all of the participants and volunteers who faithfully came out to support the medical center on a rare rainy day. Special thanks and appreciation goes out to our generous sponsors who really made the day possible."

Through the contributions collected on behalf of the event, more than \$10,000 was raised. The proceeds from the outing will go a long way in helping Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation make a positive impact on the health of the community. Mile Bluff's President and CEO, James O'Keefe, stated, "Support from this golf outing will help us continue to enhance our services for our patients throughout the region."

The foundation's vision is to build community partnerships that ensure lifelong commitments to healthcare advancement, personal well-being and improvement throughout Mile Bluff's six-county service area. It is through efforts like the golf outing that this vision is able to be carried out.

### Community members help save lives

Approximately 39,000 units of blood are needed in hospitals across the country every day. Blood could be needed by a mother experiencing complications during birth, a father undergoing heart surgery, a child receiving chemotherapy treatments or a grandparent with severe anemia.



To help meet these demands, Mile Bluff Medical Center in Mauston recently hosted a community blood drive on September 17 and 18. The event was a partnership between the medical center and the Blood Center of Wisconsin - the only supplier of blood to Mile Bluff.

At the drive a total of 76 area residents came to Mile Bluff to make a donation. From these individuals, 58 units of whole blood, five units of double red cells, and four units of platelets were collected. Each of these donations can help improve the lives of up to three people in need. That means that the donations from this event alone will have the potential to impact nearly 200 individuals!

In addition to the donors, blood drive organizers would like to thank Mile Bluff's Food and Nutrition Department for providing tasty refreshments, Eastern Star for volunteering to serve the food, the staff from the Blood Center of Wisconsin in Marshfield for making a trip to Mauston, and everyone else who helped get the word out about the event.

If you missed this most recent opportunity to make an impact on the local blood supply, Mile Bluff will be holding another drive on Monday, November 19 and Tuesday, November 20 from 9 am to 2 pm both days. If you choose to donate, you will have the opportunity to make a whole blood, double red or platelet donation. 
