





Since the move, Pam has donated some of her time leading an inter-faith Bible study twice a month at Crest View; and for an hour every month, she also sings and plays the piano in the dining room area. Pam enjoys interacting with the residents, and has even taught them how to play color-coded bells. "Being retired and a 'young senior,' volunteering gives me something to do and gives me purpose," said Pam.

She has worked with senior citizens for the last 30 years, and has experience working with Alzheimer's patients. In Illinois, she served as an activity director and special events planner at a nursing home. "When I was younger and first started working with seniors, I was nervous," explained Pam. "But the more I was around them, the more I learned. Now I enjoy working with the residents because they have so much to teach us. It has been a great experience for me."

All nine of Pam's grandchildren have visited the nursing home, and she says they feel right at home. "I think the biggest obstacle is feeling comfortable," she explains. Pam said the residents have been very friendly and encouraging, and have welcomed her with open arms. They have gotten to know each other quite well, especially through the Bible study, and the residents even call her by her first name. Wild Whooping Crane Chick Hatches at Necedah NWR

Congratulations to the newest Whooping Crane parents at Necedah National Wildlife Refuge! Aerial

surveys conducted on July 8th confirmed the hatch of wild chick W3-13 by Whooping Crane pair 9-03/3-04. The nest is located in Rynearson Pool 1 at Necedah National Wildlife Refuge. Cranes are now in an area of drawdown, which will provide ample resources for the new family to forage on throughout the summer season.

This is the 6th nesting season for Whooping Crane pair 9-03/3-04. Of the nine nesting attempts over the past six seasons, only two attempts (years 2010 and 2013) have produced chicks. Chick W3-13 is expected to fledge in late September, or approximately three months after hatching. Refuge biologists have observed both parents provisioning downward, which could indicate two chicks have hatched. While two eggs were observed at the nesting site, only one chick is confirmed at this time. Refuge biologists will continue to monitor the site and Whooping Cranes.

Necedah NWR staff reminds anyone who encounters a whooping crane in the wild to please give them the respect and distance they need. Do not approach birds on foot within 200 yards; remain in your vehicle; do not approach in a vehicle any closer than 100 yards. To report Whooping Crane sightings, visit the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Endangered Species website at: <http://www.fws.gov/midwest/whoopingcrane/sightings/sightingform.cfm>

August is Back-to-School Safety Month

Summer vacation is nearing its end, and children will be heading back to school soon. It's the time of year when students wonder where the summer went, and parents look ahead to the 'normal' routine. Some children will be starting school for the very first time, while others will be continuing their educational careers. One thing, however, is certain; all students need to be safe.

By sharing safety tips and guidelines, Mile Bluff Medical Center encourages child safety. This August, Mile Bluff is observing Back-to-School Safety Month by promoting safe travel to and from school, proper use/wear of backpacks, home safety, as well as vaccinations.

Safe Travel

It's important for children to know how to stay safe during their day-to-day travels. When waiting for the school bus, children should stand back from the curb and wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before boarding. When on the bus, children should remember not to push or rush to get a seat, and should always listen to the bus driver. Make sure children know to wait for the bus driver to signal when it is safe to cross the street after getting off the bus. If children are walking to and from school, they should have a set route and should contact their parents when they arrive at their destination. When walking, children should travel in groups and never accept rides unless prearranged by their parents.



Wearing backpacks

As classes begin, children will be carrying their homework and books back and forth in backpacks that can often become heavy. If not worn properly, these can cause injury. When purchasing a backpack, it's important to get the right size.

Backpacks should fit closely to the body and sit no lower than two inches above the waist. Children should not carry more than 15 percent of their bodyweight, and should lift their pack with both hands in order to prevent back strain. Children should also use both shoulder straps to distribute the backpack's weight evenly.



Home alone

When children return home from school, they may be alone for a few hours until their parents are done with work. Having children stay home alone for the first time can be frightening for both parents and children. Parents should be sure their children feel comfortable staying home alone and are able to care for themselves without constant supervision. It's important to remember not to let convenience be the deciding factor in letting a child stay home alone.

Parents are in charge, even from a distance, so be sure to set specific rules for kids to follow. Children should be cautious when returning to their home alone. If they spot something suspicious — like an unlocked door or broken window — they should go to a trusted neighbor's house. Children should also remember not to tell anyone who calls on the phone that no parents are in the house, and kids should never open the door — even for someone they know.

Vaccinations

The medical staff at Mile Bluff recommends that every child going to preschool or grade school be up-to-date on all vaccinations before beginning the school year. Vaccinations offer safe and effective protection from infectious diseases. By staying current on recommended vaccines, children can protect themselves, their family, friends and community from serious, life-threatening infections. Vaccines stimulate the immune system to react as if there were a real infection — they fend off the "infection" and remember the organism in order to fight it quickly should it enter the body later.

Receiving vaccinations can be a scary and stressful time for children and their parents. To make the vaccination process easier, parents should tell older children what's going to happen and that the shots help to keep them healthy. It's okay for younger children to cry, but they should be encouraged to be brave. Parents should be calm as well, because children pick up on their concern. After the appointment, plan a fun activity — like a trip to the park — to make the overall experience less unpleasant.



By traveling safely, wearing backpacks properly, being cautious when home alone, and receiving vaccinations, children are more likely to be safe. Mile Bluff would like to wish all students the best of luck this year as they return to school. Study hard and be safe!




