2024 Schedule of Services

Leaves

The City provides curbside pickup of leaves on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month. No phone call is required.

In the Spring:

Place leaves in brown paper bags (no plastic bags) and place in the boulevard for pickup.

In the Fall:

(September - November) rake leaves into the gutter and the city will vacuum them, or put in brown paper bags and place them curbside for pickup. Please be sure to keep leaves away from poles and hydrants so the vacuum can reach them.

Brush

The City provides curbside pickup of brush the 2nd and 4th Monday's from April – October. No phone call is required for pickup

Brush must be placed in the boulevard parallel to the street, but not in the street

Christmas Tree Collection

Christmas trees are collected curbside from January 1 – February 1. Light strings, ornaments, tree stands and other metal or plastic must be removed.

Special Residential Clean-up dates!

The City will offer 2 special clean-up events this year:

- **April 9**
- **October 8**

Ads placed on the City website and Facebook page prior to clean-up week will provide more information on what types of items will be picked up.

Fire Hydrants

Fire hydrants that are blocked or difficult to access due to snow and ice impede emergency fire response. Help reduce the risk by keeping fire hydrants accessible and clear of snow and ice at least 3 feet around hydrant.
