### MAUSTON FARMERS’ MARKET POLICIES & PROCEDURES 2020

The Mauston Farmers’ Market is sponsored by the Greater Mauston Area Chamber of Commerce. It’s purpose is to provide local growers and producers of farm-related products in addition to other hand-made products the opportunity to expand their marketing and promote local trade and tourism.

**Market Hours: Saturdays:** 7am until sold. Tables may be set up after 6 a.m.  
**Tuesdays:** 2pm to 6pm. Tables may be set up after 1pm.

**Market Dates:** Every Saturday May 2nd through October 31st and Tuesday afternoon May 5th through October 27th (weather permitting)

**Market Location:** Juneau County Courthouse. No electricity is available. No carpets will be laid on the grass. Tables & chairs must be provided by the vendor. Set up is first come, first serve. There are no reserved or assigned vendor spots. **No vehicles or trailers are allowed on the lawn or in front of the market area on State Street after 7am Saturday, or after 2pm Tuesday.** Vendors arriving after the start of the farmers’ market or leaving before the end are asked to complete the loading/unloading of their vehicle, move their vehicle, then proceed to setup their stand.

**Approved Items:** Wisconsin homegrown fruits and vegetables. **Food products can not be bought and resold due to the new guidelines.** “The Pickle Bill,” allows the sale of jams, jellies, pickles & salsa. “The Cookie Bill” allows the sale of ‘non-dangerous’ baked goods. Eggs, honey, maple syrup, fruit juices, baked goods, preserves, cheese, meats and refrigerated foods must come from a licensed facility.\* Flowers, crafts, and other items not listed but deemed appropriate by the Department of Health & the Chamber of Commerce, may also be approved.

**All items must be home-grown or home-made for selling.**

**Prohibited Items:** Live animals, flea market items, semi-trailers and other items not listed or deemed inappropriate by the Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber of Commerce will be policing and enforcing the policies.

**Permits:** None required by the city. A \$25 Non-Refundable Pre-registration with the Chamber of Commerce is required of all vendors in order to participate. You will receive a registration certificate in the mail once we have received your completed registration application. This certificate must be openly displayed in your area each Saturday/Tuesday.

**Clean Up:** Vendors must keep their area clean of all types of refuse, clean up, and dispose of all refuse at the close of their sales day. No items may be left in the park when you leave. Please make sure you take all of your items and waste from the day.

**Canopy Safety:** See attached information for the full canopy safety policy.

**Insurance:** Sellers are responsible for their own personal liability and product liability insurance.

**Legal Requirements:** Sellers are responsible for full compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws and ordinances.

**Expectations:** Professional behavior with an emphasis on customer service should be the focus of all farmers’ market vendors. Please see the enclosed information for the full description of expectations by vendors including complaint and resolution process.
