

BREAKING NEWS

May 15, 2018

Anyone who has been to Riverside Park in downtown Mauston lately has noticed the installation of panels along the sidewalk. The panels are part of a new "StoryWalk" project, from the Hatch Public Library. With funding from the Friends of the Hatch Public Library, Kwik Trip Kares and the Kohler Foundation, and with support of the City of Mauston Parks Board, the StoryWalk is now open!

Mauston's StoryWalk is a series of 16 panels. Panel number one starts behind the Hatch Public Library in Riverside Park. Walkers, joggers, families, strollers, bikers, all follow the sidewalk from panel to panel, reading a page from a book, and ending with panel sixteen at Murphy Park, about a one mile walk in all. The StoryWalk encourages outdoor activity, literacy and the use of Mauston's new north side Riverwalk. The panels are made to be changed and the Library plans to install a new book in the StoryWalk seasonally.

The first book in the new StoryWalk project is Good Trick, Walking Stick, by Sheri Mabry Bestor, an author from Cedarburg, Wisconsin. The story takes the reader through the life cycle of the insect, while the bold and bright illustrations by Jonny Lambert vividly portray the four seasons of Wisconsin.

The StoryWalk is a permanent addition to the Mauston City parks, but Good Trick, Walking Stick is only here until September.

You can help someone in need. Make a blood donation on May 29 during the drive at Mile Bluff Medical Center in Mauston. To reserve your spot, call the Blood Center of Wisconsin at 1-877-232-4376 or log-on to www.bcw.edu/milebluff to make an appointment. Walk-ins are welcome.

Requirements for being a blood donor:

- Be at least 17 years old (16-year-olds may donate with parental consent)
- Weigh at least 110 lbs.
- Feel well on day of donation
- Be free of major cold and flu symptoms
- Present a photo ID with birth date
- Not have had hepatitis after age 11 years

Not have had any risk factors/behaviors associated with HIV/AIDS

Tips to remember the day you donate:

Bring along a photo ID such as a driver's license.

Drink plenty of fluids prior to and following your donation.

Avoid strenuous physical exercise until the day following your donation.

Lil' Lambs in Mauston is now open!*

If you've driven down Division Street in Mauston recently, you may have noticed a new sign outside one of the buildings. Lil' Lambs Childcare Center is now open and serving local families! The facility is located at 911 Division Street, and is owned and operated by St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Mauston. Its hours of operation are weekdays, 6:30 am to 5:30 pm.



Lil' Lambs is licensed by the state of Wisconsin, and is open to all families in the community with children ages six weeks to 11 years. It is a faith-based learning center, but families do not have to be members of St. Paul's to take advantage of the great service Lil' Lambs has to offer.

Lil' Lambs provides opportunities for children to develop independence and create a positive self-esteem. Using God's Word as a guide, children are encouraged to be creative, make good choices, and practice problem-solving techniques.

Research shows that children learn best through play that is active and hands-on. At Lil' Lambs, children are given the opportunity to learn on their own, and in group settings. Some of the regular educational activities include: devotions, art, music, literature, science, math, sensory play, cooking, and daily outdoor play.

According to the center's director, Shar Weibel, "Our mission is to be a high-quality, Christ-centered early childhood education resource for families of the Mauston area." Shar continued, "Our philosophy **is to demonstrate God's love through daily activities, while allowing children to grow and learn** physically, socially, emotionally and intellectually."

The current team at Lil' Lambs is made up of four individuals who have more than 50 years of combined experience in the childcare industry. Each staff member works to ensure that the unique needs of every child and family are focused on daily. "The plan is to add some additional team members before the busy summer months arrive" explained Shar.

Policy - It is the policy of the City of Mauston to allow advertising at Veterans Park softball fields and the dog park at Oak Ridge Park, and to require fees for such advertising.

Procedure - Organizations and businesses interested in advertising shall enter into a contractual agreement with the City of Mauston Parks Department and agreeing to the following guidelines:

1. Signage will be made of weather resistant material.
2. Signage will be printed on one side only.
3. Signage will be securely mounted.
4. Mauston Parks Department will have approval of all advertising. The application process will be as follows:
 - a. A completed Advertising Application will be submitted to Mauston Public Works prior to the period which the organization wishes to advertise. Applicants will be notified of application status.
 - b. Application must include their logo and a 5-6 word message.
 - c. Once the Application is approved and signed, the organization will make full payment.
5. Signage shall not contain material that:
 - a. Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or gaming products.
 - b. Is vulgar, indecent or obscene.
 - c. Contains libelous statements, personal attacks or language defaming a person's character, race, religion, ethnic origin, gender, family status or disability.
 - d. Encourages the commission of unlawful acts or the violation school regulations.
 - e. Promotes or opposes controversial issues or matters.
 - f. Encourages actions that endanger the health and safety of participants.
 - g. Promotes or opposes any political, religious, philosophical, or ideological message.
 - h. Contains grammatical or typographical errors.
 - i. Competes or is in direct conflict with City-sponsored programs or activities.
6. Signage will only be permitted through the designated period agreed to on the application and contract.
7. The Mauston Parks Department will determine exact placement and location on fencing, and signage will be placed so as not to interfere with field maintenance and repair.
8. The business/organization recognizes the said sites are used by multiple entities.
9. All signage will meet City of Mauston ordinance Section 114-258 General signage regulations.
