

IF YOU MOVED TO WISCONSIN AFTER OCTOBER 6, 2020 YOU MAY STILL BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE

Any resident that moves to Wisconsin after October 6, 2020, will not be able to meet the **28-day residency requirement** and, as such, would not be able to register and vote a full ballot. Voters in this situation should first check with their former state of residency to see what options are available for them there. If they are unable to vote in their previous state of residency, they may still cast a **Presidential-only ballot** in Wisconsin if they are otherwise qualified to vote here.

To receive a Presidential-only ballot voters must:

- **Complete an Application for Presidential Ballot**
 - **New Wisconsin Resident form #EL-141**
- **Provide Proof of Residence and Proof of Identification**
- **Complete the form to cancel registration in former state of residence**
 - **Authorization to Cancel Registration form #EL-139**

Voters **Not** Eligible for a Presidential-only ballot include:

- Residents of other states who are in Wisconsin temporarily or are passing through (i.e.: truck-drivers, temporary work assignments)
- Military Voters-these voters receive full ballots
- Permanently Overseas Voters-these voters receive a “Federal-Only” ballot with only contests for federal offices
- Temporary Overseas Voters-these voters receive the full ballot with all contests included
- Voters who have not met residency requirements at new address or do not have proof of residence-these voters are allowed under state law to vote from their former address.
